Why keep this notice?

Skilled Work Regional (Provisional) (subclass 491) visa conditions Must notify certain changes (visa condition 8578)

This condition means that you must notify us within 14 days of a change to:

- your residential address
- your email address
- your phone number
- your passport details
- your employer's address
- the address of the location of a position where you are employed.

Must stay in designated regional area (visa condition 8579)

This condition means that, while in Australia, you must live, work and study only in a part of Australia that was a designated regional area:

- if your visa is a subclass 491, at the time your visa was granted
- if your visa is a subclass 494 and you are a primary visa holder, at the time that your most recently approved nomination was lodged by your employer
- if your visa is a subclass 494 and you are a secondary visa holder, at the time that the primary visa holder's most recently approved nomination was lodged by their employer

As this list may change from time to time, you should keep a copy of this information at the time relevant to your visa.

Provide evidence of addresses as requested (visa condition 8580)

This condition means that, if requested, you must provide us with evidence of any of the following within 28 days:

- your residential address
- the address of your employer/s
- the address where your job is located
- the address of your educational institution.

Must attend interview (visa condition 8581)

This condition means that you must attend an interview with us if you are invited to do so in writing.

Australian working conditions

Workplace rights

Pay rates and workplace conditions are set by Australian law. All people working in Australia, including those from overseas, have rights and protections at work. These cannot be taken away by contracts or agreements.

If you have questions about your pay and conditions while in Australia, you can contact the Fair Work Ombudsman for free information, resources and advice.

Pay

Your minimum pay rate can come from an award, enterprise agreement or other registered agreement, or the national minimum wage. Employees have to be paid the right pay rate for all hours they work including training, team meetings, opening and closing the business and doing a trial shift.

National minimum wage

Certain employees may have different pay entitlements depending on whether they have a reduced work capacity because of disability, if they are under the age of 21 or if they are an apprentice or trainee. Tax file number

To receive an income in Australia, you need a Tax File Number (TFN). Income includes wages or salary from a job, government payments and income from investments.

Character requirements

Entering or remaining in Australia is a privilege. You must obey the law and not engage in criminal activity.

Your visa may be cancelled for a number of reasons, including if you have a substantial criminal record or behave in a way that is a risk to somebody in the Australian community.

Update us

To comply with visa condition 8578 you are required to tell us about changes to certain details within 14 days. To tell us about these changes you should log back into your application in your ImmiAccount, click 'Update details' and complete the relevant form.

- You should use the *Regional contact details* form to tell us about changes to your residential address, email address, phone numbers, employment details or education details.
- If you get a new passport you should complete the *Change of passport details* form.

If your application was lodged by a registered migration agent, legal practitioner or your employer you will need to create your own ImmiAccount and import your application to access these forms.

If your application does not appear in the *'List of applications'* you will need to click on 'Import application' and add the application details found in the Visa summary section of this letter.

If your application was combined with another family member's application, the main applicant will need to complete the relevant form on your behalf.

You are required to tell us about any other changes to your details as soon as possible such as changes to your name or your family composition.

If you do not notify us of your new details, this can have serious consequences for you.

Free Translating Service

You may be eligible to have up to 10 personal documents translated, into English, within the first two years of your visa grant date through the Commonwealth Government's Free Translating Service.

Free English language tuition

The Commonwealth Government provides free English language tuition to eligible visa holders through the Adult Migrant English Program (AMEP). You must register for the program within six months of your visa commencement date or the date you arrive in Australia.
